Commentary on Lamentations 1:1

Rabbi Alexandri opened his discourse with the text, *And the leper in whom the plague is* (Lev. 13:45): *The leper* is like the Temple; *in whom the plague is*, i.e. idolatry which defiles like a plague, as it is said, *And they profaned My sanctuary and defiled it. His clothes shall be rent*, i.e. the priestly vestments; *the hair of his head shall go loose*: and so it is said, *And the covering of Judah was laid bare* (Isa. 22:8) - that which should have been covered He disclosed. *And he shall cover his upper lip*: when Israel was exiled among the nations of the world, not one of them was able to bring a word of Torah out of his mouth. *And shall cry, Unclean, unclean*: i.e. the destruction of the first and second Temples.

Rabbi Jose b. Halafta said: Whoever knows how many years Israel worshipped idols also knows when the son of David (the Messiah) will come; and we have three verses to support this statement. The first is, *Thus will I punish her for the days of the Baalim, on which she brought them offerings* (Hos. 2:15), i.e. according to the number of the days of the [worship of the] Baalim shall the visitation endure. The second is, *Even as He called and they would not listen, "So," said the Lord of Hosts, "let them call and I will not listen* (Zech. 7:13). The third is, *And when they ask, "Because of what did the Lord our God do all these thing?" you shall answer them, "because* (i.e., as long as) *you forsook Me and served alien gods on your own land, you will have to serve foreigners in a land not your own."* (Jer. 5:19).

Rabbi Johanan and R. Simeon b. Lakish both made a statement on this point. R. Johanan said: [This lesson may be derived from] *Because, even because* (Lev. 26:43) indicating measure for measure. R. Simeon b. Lakish said: [It may be derived from] *Your land, strangers devour it in your presence* (Isa. 1:7): i.e. as against what you have done, strangers devour it. R. Alexandri derived it from this verse, *All the days wherein the plague is in him he shall be unclean*. [Being unclean, he shall dwell apart; his dwelling shall be outside the camp.] (Lev. 13:46).
